Location: Zion Mennonite Church, 149 Cherry Lane, Souderton

Join the Souderton faith communities as they organize a peaceful outdoor march and letter writing to support legislation to help end gun violence. All are welcome. The group comes together as one community, many inspired by their faith convictions, to honor those who have lost lives to gun murders, to witness publicly through our march, and to advocate for stronger and more effective gun laws and regulations.

The 1.3 mile walk will go through downtown Souderton, starting/ending at Zion, and stay on relatively level public sidewalks.


