Homeless Task Force – Message from Education Team

Verse: Proverbs 22:6 GNT

Teach children how they should live and they will remember it all their life.

Fact: Earlier this year, North Penn High School was reporting a point in time count of approximately 80 students experiencing homelessness. According to the Institute for Children, Poverty, and Homelessness, the top 5 reasons for missing school are:

- 1. Family priority is survival needs. 82%
- 2. Lack of transportation 43%
- 3. Inability to do homework due to a lack of study area. 42%
- 4. Lack of clothing and supplies 30%
- 5. Poor health and medical care 29%
